**ORDINANCE NO. 027 OF 2021**

**ORDINANCE NO. 028 OF 2021**

**AN ORDINANCE DECLARING MOVABLE PROPERTY TO BE SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF NATCHITOCHEs, LOUISIANA, TO CONVEY SAID MOVABLE SURPLUS PROPERTY TO NATCHITOCHEs PARISH FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 10 OF NATCHITOCHEs PARISH, WHOSE FUNCTIONS INCLUDE PUBLIC SAFETY; PROVIDING FOR ADVERTISING, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Natchitoches (sometimes hereinafter referred to as the “City”) is a Municipality located in the State of Louisiana, Parish of Natchitoches governed under a Home Rule Charter and a Code of Ordinances adopted by Ordinance No. 5 of 1977, and is a political subdivision of the State of Louisiana; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the Fire Protection District No. 10 (sometimes hereinafter referred to as the “Fire District”) is a fire protection district of Natchitoches Parish Louisiana, and was created in by ordinance of the Natchitoches Parish Police Jury; the Fire District was created to acquire buildings, machinery, equipment, and any other such things necessary to provide proper fire prevention and control within the District.

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City is the owner of nine (9) self contained breathing apparatuses that are more fully described as SCOTT AIR-PAX Model, bearing serial numbers of 530438, 530417, 530407, 530425, 530422, 530412, 530421, 530432, and 530409 (sometimes hereinafter referred to as “SCBA’s”); and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the SCBA’s are in such a condition that they are not currently in service and cannot be placed back in service without certification and recharging, and the City Council is of the opinion that the SCBA’s are not needed for any public purpose by the City and may be declared to be surplus property; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the Fire District has expressed a desire to acquire the SCBA’s for use in the NPF10; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, there is a general prohibition against the donation of public property set forth in Article 7, Section 14 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana; however subsection (E) includes an exception which provides as follows, to-wit:

“(E) Surplus Property. Nothing in this Section shall prohibit the donation or exchange of movable surplus property between or among political subdivisions whose functions include public safety.” And

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, a similar exception may be found at LA R.S. 38:2319.21, which also permits the donation or exchange of movable surplus property between or among political subdivisions of the state whose functions include public safety; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City desires to transfer and convey the SCBA's to the NPF10 where they will be used for a public purpose helping provide for the health and safety of the citizens of the Parish of Natchitoches and the Fire District; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City Council of the City of Natchitoches is of the opinion that the transfer of the SCBA's will promote the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Fire District and Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana and desires to authorize the Mayor of the City of Natchitoches to execute any document necessary to transfer the SCBA's to the Fire District; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana does hereby find that the SCBA's as fully described above are not needed by the City of Natchitoches for any public purpose.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that based on its finding that the nine (9) SCBA's that are more fully described as SCOTT AIR-PAX Model, bearing serial numbers of 530438, 530417, 530407, 530425, 530422, 530412, 530421, 530432 and 530409 are not needed for any public purpose, the City Council of the City of Natchitoches does hereby declare that the nine (9) Self Contained Breathing Apparatuses to be surplus property.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana, pursuant to the authority set forth in Article 7, Section 14(E) of the Louisiana Constitution and LA R.S. 38:2319.21, desires to and does hereby convey and transfer the nine (9) self contained breathing apparatuses that is more fully described as SCOTT AIR-PAX Model bearing serial numbers of 530438, 530417, 530407, 530425, 530422, 530412, 530421, 530432 and 530409 to Fire Protection District No.10, and that the Mayor of the City of Natchitoches, Ronnie Williams is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents that may be necessary to complete the transfer of surplus inventory on behalf of the City of Natchitoches.

**ORDINANCE NUMBER 029 OF 2021**

**AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR AFFIRMING ZONING AND IF NECESSARY REZONING CERTAIN PREMISES AS B-A OR B-SOB, AND FURTHER TO AMEND SECTIONS II, ( C ) ( 4 ) AND II, ( C ) ( 5 ) OF APPENDIX B - ZONING REGULATIONS OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, ENTITLED B-A DISTRICTS AND B-SOB DISTRICTS, TO PROVIDE FOR AN EXCEPTION TO PROVISION THAT REQUIRES TERMINATION OF CERTAIN ZONING WHEN BUSINESS DISCONTINUES FOR A TIME PERIOD, PROVIDING FOR ADVERTISING, FURTHER PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND FURTHER PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF ORDINANCE.**

**WHEREAS**, Appendix B of the Code of Ordinances provides the Zoning Regulations for the City of Natchitoches, and more specifically Section II, ( C ) ( 4 ) provides for B-A Districts and Section II, ( C ) ( 5 ) provides for B-SOB Districts; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, each of those provisions include clause that states that should the business with a B-A zoning or B-SOB zoning cease to operate for a certain time period then that B-A or B-SOB zoning shall terminate requiring that the business make a new application for the prior zoning; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, Section II, ( C ) ( 4 ) ( c ) currently provides as follows, to-wit:

“c. Nonconforming use. Any business now holding a valid permit from the City and lawfully engaged in the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises as of the effective date of this ordinance shall not be required to seek a rezoning to B-A, but shall be permitted to continue under its present district classification as a nonconforming use, except as follows:

- (1) The number of businesses in a nonconforming use shall not be increased over or exceed the number of businesses existing in the nonconforming use on the effective date of this ordinance.
- (2) The land area occupied by any nonconforming use on the effective date of this ordinance shall not be increased except to provide open off-street parking space or open off-street loading spaces for the nonconforming use, such space to be maintained in accordance with the regulations established elsewhere in the Zoning Ordinance.
- (3) A nonconforming use that has been abandoned or discontinued for any reason, such as, but not limited to, closing, suspension of permit, revocation of permit, destruction of the premises, or the like, for a continuous period of ninety (90) days shall not be re-established, and after the ninety-day period, the nonconforming use shall immediately and without further action on the part of the City terminate. **WHEREAS FURTHER**, Section II, ( C ) ( 5 ) ( c ) currently provides as follows, to-wit:

“c. Nonconforming use. Any business now lawfully engaged in the sale of items which are regulated and permitted under Chapter 19, Article VII of the Code of Ordinances as of the effective date of this Ordinance [No. 67-1999] shall not be required to seek a rezoning to B-SOB, but shall be permitted to continue under its present district classification as a nonconforming use, except as follows:

(1) The number of businesses in a nonconforming use shall not be increased over or exceed the number of businesses existing in the nonconforming use on the effective date of this Ordinance [No. 67-1999].

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the above provisions, together with the various executive orders of the Governor of the State of Louisiana, could lead to the loss of B-A and B-SOB zoning for businesses in the City of Natchitoches, an unanticipated and unintended result of the current ordinance; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City Council of the City of Natchitoches, to the extent it may be necessary, desires to reaffirm the B-A zoning and / or B-SOB zoning for those businesses that were so zoned prior to the first shutdown as ordered by the Office of the Governor of the State of Louisiana, and, if necessary, rezone as B-A or B-SOB all of those businesses that were so zoned prior to the first shutdown as ordered by the Office of the Governor of the State of Louisiana; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City Council of the City of Natchitoches desires to amend and reenact Section II, ( C ) ( 4 ) ( c ) of Appendix B of the Code of Ordinances to provide as follows, to-wit:

“c. Nonconforming use. Any business now holding a valid permit from the City and lawfully engaged in the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises as of the effective date of this ordinance shall not be required to seek a rezoning to B-A, but shall be permitted to continue under its present district classification as a nonconforming use, except as follows:

(1) The number of businesses in a nonconforming use shall not be increased over or exceed the number of businesses existing in the nonconforming use on the effective date of this ordinance.

Any business now lawfully engaged in the sale of items which are regulated and permitted under Chapter 19, Article VII of the Code of Ordinances as of the effective date of this Ordinance [No. 67-1999] shall not be required to seek a rezoning to B-SOB, but shall be permitted to continue under its present district classification as a nonconforming use, except as follows:

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** the City Council of the City of Natchitoches, to the extent it may be necessary, desires to reaffirm the B-A zoning and / or B-SOB zoning for those businesses that were so zoned prior to the first shutdown as ordered by the Office of the Governor of the State of Louisiana, and, if necessary, rezone as B-A or B-SOB all of those businesses that were so zoned prior to the first shutdown as ordered by the Office of the Governor of the State of Louisiana.

**SECTION 2.** Section II, ( C ) (4) ( c ) of Appendix B of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Natchitoches is hereby amended to provide as follows:

“c. Nonconforming use. Any business now holding a valid permit from the City and lawfully engaged in the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises as of the effective date of this ordinance shall not be required to seek a rezoning to B-A, but shall be permitted to continue under its present district classification as a nonconforming use, except as follows:

**SECTION 4.** All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 5.** If any portion of this Ordinance is declared to be invalid or unconstitutional in any manner, the invalidity shall be limited to that particular section or provision, and shall not affect the remaining portions of the ordinance, which shall remain valid and enforceable, it being the intention of the City Council that each separate provision shall be deemed independent of all other provisions herein.

**SECTION 6.** This Ordinance shall go into effect upon publication and in accordance with law.

**A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT LOCAL NON-PROFIT EFFORTS TO SEEK FUNDING FOR A MEMORIAL SCULPTURE AND MONUMENT TO CLEMENTINE HUNTER, FOR DEDICATED SPACE EITHER IN THE CIRCLE AT THE NORTH END OF FRONT STREET IN FRONT OF THE LOUISIANA STATE MUSEUM, IF FEASIBLE, OR NEARBY ON THE RIVERBANK NEAR THE ROQUE HOUSE, AND TO ASSIST IN PROVIDING ANY ANCILLARY SERVICES OR PERMITTING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND PLACEMENT OF THE MEMORIAL AND TO PROVIDE MAINTENANCE FOR THE MEMORIAL ONCE INSTALLED.**

**WHEREAS**, the distinguished artist Clementine Hunter was a lifelong citizen of the Natchitoches Parish and represents the notable artistic legacy of the Cane River area and Natchitoches, and

**WHEREAS**, Clementine Hunter was born in either late December 1886 or early January 1887 to a creole family at Hidden Hill Plantation, near Cloutierville; and

**WHEREAS**, Clementine was the eldest of seven children born to Mary Antoinette Adams and Janvier "John" Reuben; and

**WHEREAS**, although there is some doubt about her actual date of birth, it is generally believed that Clementine Hunter was at least one hundred years old when she died on January 1, 1988; and

**WHEREAS**, Clementine worked as a farm laborer at Melrose Plantation during her youth where she picked and cotton, harvested pecans, planted vegetables, and occasionally attended school, although she never learned to read and write; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1924, she married Emmanuel Hunter, who was a woodchopper at Melrose Plantation; she had seven children; and

**WHEREAS**, in her fifties, Clementine began painting with materials left behind by a visitor; she became a self-taught artist who produced art work depicting plantation life in the early twentieth century; and

**WHEREAS**, although Clementine Hunter's works sold for as little as twenty five cents, at present, her paintings and quilts are considered to be of priceless value; and

**WHEREAS**, overtime Clementine Hunter's paintings have gained international acclaim, and her art has been celebrated in film documentaries, on stage, and in art galleries across the United States and the world, including the National Gallery of Art and the National Museum of African American History and Culture in Washington, D.C.; and the Louvre in Paris, France; and

**WHEREAS**, she received an Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts degree from Northwestern State University in 1986; and

**WHEREAS**, Clementine Hunter is retrospectively viewed as an early feminist because her paintings consistently depict women in a more prominent posture than men, thus evincing her view that women contributed more to stabilizing home and society; and

**WHEREAS**, as the only black folk artist to create a significant body of work giving voice to her people's experience in the rural and agrarian south, Clementine Hunter occupies a unique position in the history of American art; and



**WHEREAS**, her creations documented a period of history that other artists failed to consider, and in doing so, gave others a taste of the rhythms and rituals of the Cane River coast; and

**WHEREAS**, a resilient lady of small physical stature, through her paintings and quilts, Clementine Hunter occupies a place at the pinnacle of American culture; and

**WHEREAS**, the Legislature of Louisiana has designated the first of October annually as “Clementine Hunter Day” in Louisiana during the 2019 Regular Session, House Concurrent Resolution No. 107, to celebrate the legacy of Clementine Hunter, whose life and artistic achievements have immeasurably benefitted the citizens of the great state of Louisiana; and

**THEREFORE**, the City Council of Natchitoches resolves to support local non-profit efforts to seek funding for a memorial sculpture and monument to Clementine Hunter,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, the City Council of Natchitoches resolves to dedicate space either in the circle at the north end of Front Street in front of the Louisiana State Museum, if feasible, or nearby on the riverbank near the Roque House, and to assist in providing any ancillary services or permitting for the construction and placement of the memorial and to provide maintenance for the memorial once installed.

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City of Natchitoches is specifically authorized under Section 1.06 of the Charter of the City of Natchitoches to provide for the general welfare, safety, health, peace and good order of the City, and further authorized under Section 1.07 of the Charter of the City of Natchitoches to enter into Joint Service Agreements or Cooperative Efforts with other governmental agencies; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the Louisiana Department of Veterans Affairs (sometimes hereinafter referred to as “LDVA”) is a state agency within the Executive Branch of the State of Louisiana; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the Louisiana Revised Statute - Title 29: Section 251-262, as amended and reenacted, specifically provides enabling legislation for LDVA, as to estimate and recover part of the operations cost of parish veterans service offices; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the CITY desires to support local veterans and improve their access to benefits and services by providing for both the cost to maintain and operate veterans service offices and space to house such service offices as provided by law, more fully identified in the attached Cooperative Agreement; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City of Natchitoches shall pay to the order of LDVA an annual payment of \$10,796.00 to support the cost to operate and maintain the veterans service office; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, this Cooperative Agreement shall be in effect from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022; and

**WHEREAS FURTHER**, the City Council of the City of Natchitoches desires to approve the attached Cooperative Agreement, and further desires to authorize the Mayor, Ronnie Williams Jr., to execute same on behalf of the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council in legal session convened that it does hereby approve the Cooperative Agreement between the City of Natchitoches and the Louisiana Department of Veterans Affairs.
